Who

Students that may be interested in the MSN (Nursing Education track) degree are students with a BSN and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 in their major. Prospective students may have precepted nurses and/or student nurses in the clinical setting, may have taught practical nurses, or may have a desire to better understand how to advance the profession of nursing by educating others.

Nurse Educator Certificate

Plan of Study

Utilizing a blended format, the Nurse Educator Certificate is designed for nurses who are seeking to acquire advanced knowledge in the field with a special focus on teaching in an academic environment and/or the healthcare setting. Candidates for the Nurse Educator Certificate will complete a series of three 3credit and one 5-credit blended courses during the summer, fall and spring semesters. The four courses include four courses, and a practicum/capstone project, totaling 14 credits.
